Aunglan District urged to develop cotton industries

Enhancing agriculture and livestock businesses in the region is expected to significantly boost local economic growth.

Chairman of the State Security and Peace Commission of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar Senior General Min Aung Hlaing, accompanied by Commission Secretary, and Joint Executive Chief General Ye Win Oo, Union ministers, senior Tatmadaw officers from the Office of the Commander-in-Chief, the Magway Region Chief Minister, the commander of Central Command and officials, met departmental officials at the hall of Aunglan District General Administrator’s office in Aunglan to discuss regional development activities.

The Aunglan District Administrator reported on agricultural and livestock activities in the region, rice sufficiency,

growing of trees to green the district, efforts to improve education and health sectors, preparations to successfully hold the election, and the need to upgrade Aunglan Township Hospital.

In his response, the Senior General stressed the need for all to cooperate in the security, peace and stability of the Aunglan region. He pledged to upgrade Aunglan Township Hospital in accordance with the relevant criteria. He urged

Global aid pours into Myanmar as quake toll hits 3,779

AS of 20 August, a total of 3,779 people died, 5,104 were injured, and 29 remain missing in six regions and states of Myanmar that were severely affected by the 28 March earthquake.

Search and rescue teams from the Myanmar Fire Brigade, along with local and international rescue organizations, have been carrying out emergency operations in the affected areas without delay. So far, 653 people have been rescued alive from collapsed buildings, and the bodies of 857 deceased persons have been recovered.

Local and foreign donors have been providing financial and material support to the affected people, with further announcements on donations forthcoming. — MNA/MKKS

ACCORDING to the 6:30 pm MST observation today, the water level of the Sittoung River at Madauk has exceeded by about 12 feet above its danger level. It may fall about three inches during the next one day and may remain above its danger level.

It is especially alert to the people who settle near the river banks and low-lying areas in Madauk, to stay away from the flood-prone areas. — DMH

Myanmar’s first international Elephant Museum opens at Yangon Zoo

THE Yangon Zoo has invited the public to explore Myanmar’s first international natural heritage sanctuary, the Elephant Museum inside the zoo, as one of the must-visit destinations.

The elephant museum is dedicated to Asian elephants, their habitats and habits, and it will provide an in-depth look at the habitats and habits of the wildlife in Myanmar, as well as details of their history in

different ages.

The museum also features utensils of rare elephants, ancient elephant bones, fossils, tusks, skeletons of a whole elephant, Myanmar handi-crafts made with elephant body parts, and books on elephant-keeping techniques for personal exploration.

It was opened inside the Yangon Zoo on World Wildlife Day on 3 March 2019, aiming to protect elephants and educate the public. The museum will contribute to raising public awareness on elephant conservation, combating illicit trafficking of elephant parts, reducing human-elephant conflicts, preventing their extinction and participating in the wildlife conservation campaigns.

The Yangon Zoo is open from 8 am to 4 pm every day, and elephant lovers are invited to visit the Elephant Museum located inside the zoo, it stated. — MT/ZN

Myanmar Daily Weather Report

BAY INFERENCE: Monsoon is weak over the Andaman Sea and South Bay and moderate elsewhere over the Bay of Bengal.

FORECAST VALID UNTIL NOON OF 21 August 2025: Rain or thundershowers will be isolated in Mandalay Region, scattered in Lower Sagaing Region and Kayah, northern Shan States, fairly widespread in Nay Pyi Taw, Bago, Magway, Taninthayi Regions and Kayin, Chin, Rakhine, (southern and eastern) Shan States and widespread in the remaining Regions and States with likelihood of isolated heavy falls in Kachin State. Degree of certainty is 100 per cent.

THE CONDITION OF CUMULONIMBUS

CLOUD: The cumulonimbus clouds are developing in Yangon, Mandalay, Bago, Magway, Sagaing, Ayeyawady, Taninthayi Regions and Kachin, Kayin, Mon, Shan States. The area along the cumulonimbus clouds movement, the weather phenomena such as strong winds accompanied with rain, thunder, lightning and hail may occur and therefore it is recommended to be aware in advance of these phenomena.

STATE OF THE SEA: Sea will be moderate in Myanmar waters. Wave height will be about 5-8 feet off and along Myanmar Coasts.

OUTLOOK FOR SUBSEQUENT TWO DAYS: Likelihood of increase of rain in Upper Sagaing,

Taninthayi Regions and Kachin, Kayin, Mon, Shan States.

FORECAST FOR NAY PYITAW AND NEIGHBOURING AREA FOR 21 August 2025: Isolated rain or thundershowers. Degree of certainty is 100 per cent.

FORECAST FOR YANGON AND NEIGHBOURING AREA FOR 21 August 2025: One or two times of rain or thundershowers. Degree of certainty is 100 per cent.

FORECAST FOR MANDALAY AND NEIGHBOURING AREA FOR 21 August 2025: Isolated rain or thundershowers. Degree of certainty is 100 per cent. — DMH

ARMED terrorists have been launching attacks by using residential homes and administrative buildings in towns and villages as cover, where they have forcibly settled. They aim to shield themselves from Tatmadaw counterattacks while also persuading temporarily displaced persons to return to their native areas and recruiting new members. That enables terrorists to use civilians as human shields. Tatmadaw is committed to safeguarding the sovereignty of the State and will respond to these threats based on intelligence and prevailing conditions. Therefore, residents in areas where terrorists have taken control must prioritize their safety and protect themselves from being exploited by these groups.

He highlighted that, as cotton is being cultivated in Aunglan District, it is necessary to establish cotton-related industries beginning at the basic level. Improving agriculture and livestock businesses in the region will greatly contribute to local economic growth.

He guided that the Aunglan District can implement solar power generation projects to fulfil the needs of electricity.

The Senior General stressed that since animal feed can be produced from agricultural by-products, it is possible to use such feed to raise chickens, pigs, goats, and cattle, which will better support the local food security.

In Aunglan District, he emphasized that school attendance rates are satisfactory, and efforts should continue to ensure smooth transition rates for students.

Since assuming state duties, he recounted that he has been giving guidance to plant two acres of firewood plantation in each village, and tree planting along roadsides is also being carried out to create greener and healthier surroundings.

The Senior General underscored that not only residents but also authorities are responsible for regional development. Therefore, development activities must be implemented in townships and districts as much as possible.

He noted that as the Aunglan District already has strong foundations, all stakeholders are urged to work together for the development of the region.

After the meeting, the Senior General and party inspected raising layers at Shwe Tint Wan livestock zone in Aunglan.

He gave guidance to systematically operate livestock activities, grow windbreaks in the livestock zone and carry out

cleaning tasks. Border and Ethnic Affairs Minister inspects Union National Races Village (Yangon)

UNION Minister for Border Affairs and for Ethnic Affairs Lt-Gen Yar Pyae, accompanied by the deputy minister for ethnic affairs, regional ministers for security and border affairs and ethnic affairs, met the staff of the affiliated departments at the meeting hall of Union National Races Village (Yangon) yesterday.

During the meeting, the Union minister mentioned that all should perform the primary responsibility

of the ministry to ensure the rights of the ethnic people as per the existing laws, and the department must provide all possible support to ethnic MSMEs. In the education sector, efforts must be made to help ethnic children overcome language barriers so that school dropout rates decrease. The projects to be implemented at the Union National Races Village (Yangon) in the 2025-2026 financial year must be carried out following

the budget rules and standards, and completed in time.

The deputy minister reported on projects with K20 million capital of the Union National Races Village (Yangon) and over K20 million worth of tender, income and regular work operations of the site.

Announcement of the deadline for political parties to report required party members and offices

1. The Union Election Commission has issued Announcement 55/2025 that Part I of the multiparty democratic general election will be held on 28 December 2025 as per Section 399 (a) of the Constitution of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar and responsibilities and authorities in accord with Section 10 of the Union Election Commission Law.

2. Regarding the membership of political parties, if the party will conduct organizational campaign across the Union during the period at least 90 days before the election as per the notification issued by the Union Election Commission in accord with Section 5 (f) of the Political Parties Registration Law, it has to organize at least 50,000 party members, and if the party will organize in only one region or state, it has to organize at least 1,000 members.

3. To open party offices, if the party will conduct organizational campaign across the Union during the period at least 90 days before the election as per the notification issued by the Union Election Commission in accordance with Section 5 (h) of the Political Parties Registration Law, it has to have offices at least one-third of all townships across the Union, and if the party will organize in only one region or state, it has to open offices in at least five townships in relevant region or state.

4. The Union Election Commission has notified political parties in advance to ensure that they can meet the required number of party members and establish the stipulated number of party offices in time, to enable all parties to participate in the upcoming election. If they fail to comply within the specified period, action will be taken in line with Section 12 of the Political Parties Registration Law.

5. Under Sections 5 (f) and (h) of the Political Parties Registration Law, the Commission has announced that political parties must fulfil the required number of party members and party offices and submit their reports to the Commission, not later than 7 September 2025 (Sunday).

A Myanmar-Thailand bilateral meeting on water quality management, aiming at enhancing bilateral cooperation in water quality management and monitoring, and preventing and controlling water pollution between the two countries, was organized at the Jasmine Hotel in Nay Pyi

Taw yesterday. Union Minister for Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation U Khin Maung Yi discussed the formation of the National Water Resource Committee to conserve the water resource and quality in the country, the release of National

Surface Water Quality Standards in 2024 by cooperating with international organizations, and activities to monitor the water quality. Mr Prasert Jantararungtong, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Digital Economy and Society of Thailand,

highlighted the water resource quality management measures of Thailand, policies for water pollution prevention, international cooperation, and pledged to work with Myanmar in preventing water pollution. The relevant departmental officials of the two countries re-

ported on the preventive measures for Nakhon river water quality, water quality management, surface water standards of Myanmar and further cooperation. They declared a joint statement to further promote cooperation in environmental conservation, including water quality management, exchange information related to water quality, conduct technical discussions between relevant departments of both sides, establish a joint technical working group to enhance practical cooperation in the field of sustainable water quality management, and collaborate in areas such as technical assistance, capacity building, and knowledge sharing. After the meeting, the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Digital Economy and Society of Thailand and the delegation visited the Maravijaya Buddha Image. — MNA/KTZH

Myanmar hosts Special Senior Officials Meeting ahead of 46th AMAF and related events

DIRECTOR-GENERAL Dr Thandar Kyi of the Planning Department of the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation virtually presided over the Special Senior Officials Meeting of the 46th Meeting of the ASEAN Ministers on Agriculture and Forestry and its related meetings on 19-20 August. The representatives of ASEAN members, Timor-Leste, ASEAN Secretary-General Office, CGIAR, CPOPC, CSIRO, ERIA, GIZ, TAF GTEI, FAO, GHD and Boeing, Sattva Consulting, SCSNe Coalition, Singapore Crawfish, SEAFDEC and US-ABC, Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation and Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation joined the first day of the meeting.

During the opening ceremony of the meeting, the SOM-AMAF Leader Director-General made an opening speech. They then discussed the outcomes from the ASEAN Summit and the ASEAN Economic Ministers' Meeting, the meeting of the working group on food security, agriculture and forest, minutes of four meetings from the food

security sector, six from the agricultural sector, one from the agriculture and forest product sector and one from the forestry sector. They agreed to approve the 23 recommendations on food security, agriculture and forestry

sectors and record seven plans at the 47th Meeting of the ASEAN Ministers on Agriculture and Forestry. The CGIAR discussed the progresses in ASEAN-One CGIAR Program, while CPOPC about implemen-

tation of EU Deforestation Regulation (EUDR), CSIRO about ASEAN-Australia bioprevention researches, ERIA about agricultural food security system, reduction of carbon emission in agricultural sectors and food security measures in ASEAN region, whereas the outcomes resulting from the project that utilizes rice husks for long-term sustainability by GIZ, initial measures for ASEAN Green Bond by FAO, production of sustainable aviation fuel from agricultural waste by GHD and Boeing, business models within the ASEAN region that reduce environmental impact, nature-based solution by SCSNe Coalition, lobster farming by Singapore Crawfish, proper management for eel farming in ASEAN region by SEAFDEC and promising cooperation by US-ASEAN Business Council. The Special Senior Officials Meeting of the 24th Meeting of the ASEAN Ministers on Agriculture and Forestry Plus Three and the 10th ASEAN-Russia Agriculture and Forestry High-Level Officials Meeting were also held yesterday. — MNA/KTZH

ACTS of terrorism propagating a wide range of hateful ideologies continue to injure, harm and kill thousands of innocent people each year. Only when the people stand together in unity can they overcome and defeat any form of actions of terrorism. What is needed is a firm determination among all of them to relentlessly combat and eradicate the ideology of terrorism.

International Day calls on everyone to listen to, support, and stand with victims in building a more inclusive, resilient, and peaceful future.

In this regard, everybody needs to focus on their actions leading to the interests of people. If even their acts are legitimate, they have to analyze their actions to determine whether these might be similar to terror acts and their impacts or not. They need to always consider the lives of innocent civilians to avoid intentional or unintentional acts of violence against them. It is because those innocent people do not have any arms or tactics to fight terrorists in ordinary times.

Nevertheless, the public should not passively tolerate or submit to the actions of terrorists. It is important to recognize that their collective strength is a powerful force. Only when the people stand together in unity can they overcome and defeat any form of actions of terrorism. What is needed is a firm determination among all of them to relentlessly combat and eradicate the ideology of terrorism.

Member States bear the primary responsibility for supporting victims of terrorism and upholding their rights. The United Nations assists them in implementing the UN Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy by providing capacity-building support, technical assistance, and establishing networks. It also supports civil society organizations, including those representing victims. Indeed, it is necessary to encourage Member States to promote, protect, and respect the rights of victims.

The Myanmar saying, “ဝါဆို ဝါခေါင် ရေဖောင်ဖောင်” (Waso Wakhaung, water everywhere), describes the peak of the rainy season. During the months of Waso (June to July) and Wakhaung (July to August), Myanmar experiences extremely heavy rainfall. This constant, pounding rain causes rivers and streams to overflow their banks, leading to widespread flooding. The saying is a simple, yet vivid, way of telling people that during these two months, they can expect to see water everywhere. It’s a classic example of how a culture’s proverbs reflect its environment and climate.

USAGES:
Save for a rainy day
Definition: To save money or resources for a time

when they might be needed in the future, especially for difficult or unexpected situations.

Example Sentence: I try to put a little bit of my paycheck into a savings account each month, so I have something saved for a rainy day.

Under the weather
Definition: Feeling ill or unwell.
Example Sentence: I won’t be able to make it to the meeting today; I’m feeling a bit under the weather.

Come rain or shine
Definition: No matter what happens; in all circumstances.
Example Sentence: I will be there for you, come rain or shine.

When it rains, it pours
Definition: When one bad thing happens, it is often followed by a series of other bad things.
Example Sentence: First, my car broke down, and then I lost my wallet. It’s like when it rains, it pours.

- 1. Bite off more than you can chew**

It means we don’t truly understand the value or consequence of something until we face its results. This saying shows us that going through a difficult time can make us wiser and more careful. When we make a mistake or face a hardship, we gain valuable knowledge that helps us make better decisions in the future. The proverb also encourages us to pay attention and learn from our past mistakes. For example, a person who fails a test might finally understand the importance of studying. Or, someone who loses money in a bad business deal will learn to be more cautious next time. This kind of hands-on learning helps us grow and avoid repeating the same errors.

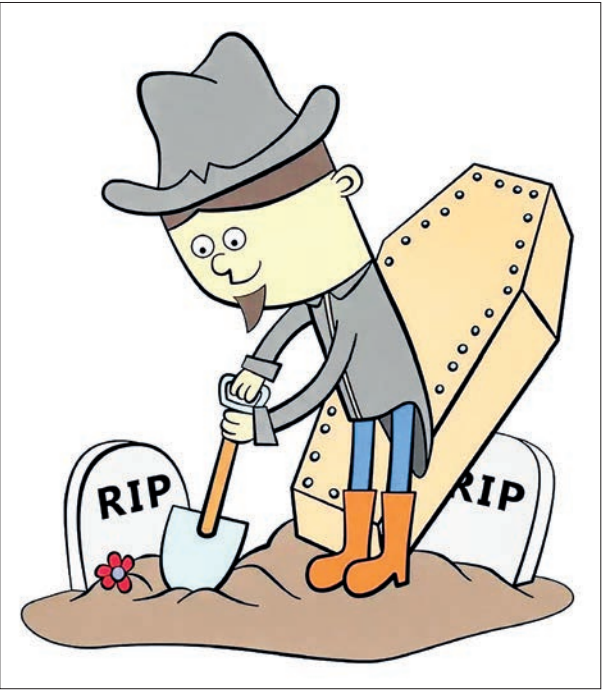
- 1. Live and learn**

Myanmar repatriates 94 undocumented Chinese nationals

A total of 94 Chinese nationals who entered Myanmar illegally through border routes and committed online gambling, online fraud, and other offenses in Kayin State, including Myawaddy, Shwe Kokko, KK Park, and Kyaukkhet have been repatriated to their respective country via the Myanmar-Thailand Friendship Bridge (No 2) with due regard to humanitarian considerations and friendly bilateral relations.

To ensure smooth and systematic repatriation, authorities inspected the coordination process, verified the completeness of records and data, and provided guidance where necessary.

The repatriation ceremony was conducted with the participation of officials from the Ministry of Labour, Immigration and Population, Kayin State, Deputy Director U Myint Phone, representatives from the Chinese Ministry of Public Security, the Criminal Investigation Department, the Law Enforcement

ment, the Law Enforcement as well as officials from the Thai Immigration Bureau. Myanmar authorities formally handed over

the repatriation documents to the respective countries' officials in an orderly manner.

From 30 January to 20 August 2025, Myanmar identified and detained a total of 9,331 foreign nationals who had entered the country illegally. Among them, 9,205 were repatriated to their countries per legal procedures via Thailand, while 126 remain ready for repatriation and are being securely maintained.

The government continues to actively investigate and take strong action against illegal online fraud operations. In particular, online gambling and financial fraud activities in Myanmar's border areas are being investigated and addressed in collaboration with neighbouring countries and international organizations, adopting a national-level approach. — MNA/KZL

Basic schools, general hospital resume services in Nawnghkio

BASIC education schools in Nawnghkio Township, which had been closed for nearly a year due to terrorist attacks, reopened on 25 July 2025. Students have resumed classes, and school enrolment activities continue. Today, three further basic education schools reopened, bringing the total number of operational schools in the township to 78. An additional 455 students were enrolled, raising the total number of students attending classes peacefully to 9,672.

Also, the township's general hospital, which had been

damaged by terrorist acts, has been repaired and reopened on 2 August to provide healthcare services to local ethnic communities. Today, the hospital provided necessary medical examinations and treatments to 38 outpatients for illnesses such as influenza, measles, and general diseases. Blood type testing was conducted for 36 residents, and malaria testing was carried out for three residents. Meanwhile, 34 residents received inpatient medical care. Medical teams continue to deliver essential healthcare services to the community. — MNA/KZL

despite rains

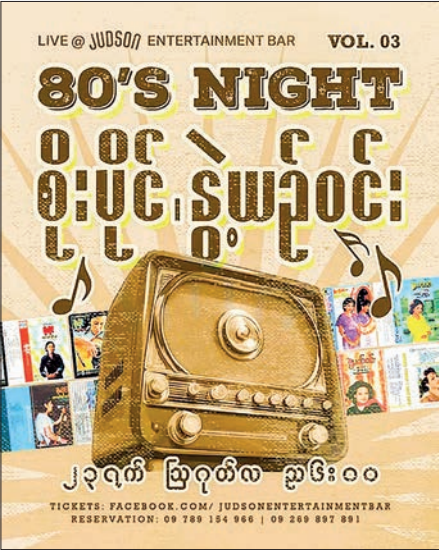

Public-Private Dialogue on boosting paddy seed production, export zone plans

MINISTRY of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation and Myanmar Rice Federation jointly organized a Public-Private Dialogue on export zones implementation and developing paddy seed production businesses was held on 18 August at the meeting hall of the ministry in Nay Pyi Taw.

Deputy Minister of the ministry and officials concerned, President of MRF and representatives, regional committee chairmen, exporters, fertilizer companies, seed production companies, and farmers participated in the dialogue.

The meeting also highlighted setting agricultural export zone on contracted farmland areas in collaboration with farmers and export companies, cultivating only paddy seed designated

for exports, collaboration between departments concerned and seed production companies to meet paddy seed needs, production in line with Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for contract farming, securing Geographical Indication status for Pawsan Hmway, premium quality rice of Myanmar to increase its international presence, bolstering exports and attaining good price to benefit growers, reducing inputs, boosting production and public-private partnership.

Furthermore, institutions concerned negotiated with counterparts of the neighbouring countries (Bangladesh and China) to ramp up exports and gain a reasonable market amid a drop in global rice prices. — NN/KK

CBM to sell \$32M fuel oil importers on 19 Aug

THE Central Bank of Myanmar (CBM) announced on 19 August that it would sell US\$32 million to fuel oil importers.

Additionally, CBM sold \$314,375 to edible oil-importing companies and \$36,550 to those who made non-trade payments, in addition to an injection of \$337,500 into the financial market on that day.

CBM sold \$700,800 to edible oil-importing companies and over \$429,200 to fuel oil-importing companies on 18 August, in addition to an injection of 579,910 yuan into the financial market.

Additionally, CBM sold over \$429,260 to CMP companies and those who made non-trade payments on that day.

CBM sold \$1.16 million to edible oil-importing companies and over \$76,600 to CMP companies and those who made non-trade payments on 15 August, in addition to an injection of \$244,000 into the financial market.

CBM pumped \$1 million and over 1.27 million yuan into the financial market on 14 August.

Furthermore, CBM sold over \$1.88 million to edible oil-importing companies and over \$220,900 to CMP com-

panies and those who made non-trade payments on the same day.

CBM announced on 13 August that it would sell \$32 million to those engaged in the fuel oil sector after sales of 300,000 yuan. CBM sold over \$1.55 million to edible oil-importing companies and over \$128,200 to CMP companies and individuals who made non-trade payments on that day.

CBM injected \$1.3 million into edible oil-importing companies and over \$467,000 into CMP companies and those who made non-trade payments after sales of over 1.97 million yuan on 12 August. Importers of refined sugar, plastic, fertilizers, pharmaceutical and medical equipment, electrical devices, industrial raw materials, construction materials, auto parts, telecommunication devices, trailers, feedstuffs, paint, tar and food commodities also purchased foreign currencies through the foreign exchange market online trading platform.

CBM sold \$36.5 million purchased from companies working on a Cut, Make and Pack basis, in addition to the injection of \$8.8 million, 13.3 million baht, 10.5 million yuan and 500,000 rupees in July. Furthermore, CBM sold over \$2.3 million to other commodities-importing companies as per its initial announcement of selling \$10 million. CBM sold \$8.4 million, 13.9 million baht and 5.2 million yuan in June 2025, in addition to the injection of \$14.9 million that was purchased from the CMP enterprises into the financial market.

CBM aims to curb the instability in the foreign exchange market and currency devaluation. According to CBM's notification on 15 March 2024, it has been collaborating with law enforcement agencies to combat and prosecute those who attempt to manipulate the currency market under the existing laws. CBM allowed authorized dealers (private banks) to operate online foreign exchange trading freely as per the market rate, depending on supply and demand, starting from 5 December 2023. — NN/KK

Japan PM proposes economic zone initiative for Africa

JAPANESE Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba proposed an “economic zone” encompassing the Indian Ocean region and Africa during a major aid conference for African nations on Wednesday. In a speech to open the three-day Tokyo International Conference on African Development, the ninth of its kind, Ishiba pledged to cultivate 30,000 artificial intelligence experts in Africa over the next three years and announced the launch of a framework to be joined by governments, industries and academia to promote free trade in the region. — Kyodo

Indian telecom sector Q1FY26 results show steady growth, 5G expansion

INDIA’S telecom sector reported an inline performance in the first quarter of FY26, with steady subscriber additions and continued execution on 5G rollouts, according to a Centrum report. The top operators, namely, Reliance Jio, Bharti Airtel, and Vodafone Idea, focused on network expansion and subscriber retention, while tower and digital service providers also reported stable growth.

As per the report, Reliance Jio led subscriber additions with 9.9 million new customers, taking its base to 498.1 million. Bharti Airtel added 1.2 million customers in its India wireless business, supported by 3.9 million smartphone additions, which helped raise its 5G user base to 152 million. Vodafone Idea, however, saw a net loss of 0.5 million subscribers, though its 4G net adds stood at 1 million, raising its 4G/5G base to 127.4 million.

Average revenue per user (ARPU), a key industry benchmark, showed steady improvement. Airtel maintained leadership at Rs250 per month, up two per cent quarter-on-quarter, aided by smartphone adoption and postpaid upgrades. — ANI

Beijing NEV production exceeds full-year 2024 level in first 7 months

BEIJING’S new energy vehicle (NEV) production surged past 310,000 units in the first seven months of 2025, exceeding its total output for the entire previous year, according to the Beijing Municipal Bureau of Economy and Information Technology.

Production in July alone reached 52,000 NEVs, representing a significant year-on-year increase of 140 per cent, said the official data.

This growth is evident at facilities like

Xiaomi’s auto super factory in the Beijing Economic-Technological Development Area, where round-the-clock shifts and robotic arms hum with activity.

An official from the bureau said surging orders of popular models such as Xiaomi’s SU7 and YU7 led companies to optimize production through smart tech upgrades, so as to boost equipment utilization and efficiency to accelerate deliveries. — Xinhua

Lavrov: Russia demands equal role in Ukraine security guarantees

- Focus should remain on developments from the 2022 Istanbul negotiations on Ukraine’s security.
- Moscow will also provide guarantees for Ukraine.
- Security framework without Russia — such talks lead nowhere.

White House launches official TikTok account

THE White House launched an official TikTok account on Tuesday, less than a month before US President Donald Trump's deadline for the social media app to either find a new owner or face a ban in the United States.

The account posted its debut video on Tuesday afternoon -- a 27-second clip featuring footage of Trump walking and interacting with his supporters, accompanied by audio from his acceptance speech at the 2016 Republican National Convention.

A few hours after the debut video, the account has garnered over 57,000 followers, while the TikTok account Trump used for his presidential campaign last year has more than 15 million followers. — Xinhua

Israel approves operation to capture Gaza City: Reports

ISRAELI Defence Minister Israel Katz has approved an operation to capture Gaza City, and reservists are expected to be mobilized, the Kan state television and radio company reported on Wednesday.

The operation was named Gideon's Chariots 2, the broadcaster added.

Some 60,000 reservist call-up orders are being issued by the IDF for the offensive, according to Israeli media.

Netanyahu's office said in a statement on 8 August that the Jewish state's Security Cabinet approved a plan to take over Gaza City and eventually implement "Israeli security control" of the entire Gaza Strip. — SPUTNIK

India-US officials discuss key issues of defence procurement

INDIAN and American defence officials held a meeting here in the national capital on Tuesday where they discussed key issues of defence procurement and affirmed their commitment towards further strengthening of the India-US defence partnership, as per the Ministry of Defence. Sharing the details in a post on X, the Ministry of Defence said, "Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defence (South & Southeast Asia), US DoD Dr Andrew Byers today met Joint Secretary (Maritime & Systems Acquisition) Shri Dinesh Kumar. They discussed key issues of defence procurement & reaffirmed commitment to further strengthen the India-US defence partnership". — ANI

Plastic model museum to open in Shizuoka, central Japan, in Sept

BANDAI Spirits Co on Wednesday unveiled a hands-on museum set to open 2 September inside its plastic model production plant in Shizuoka, central Japan, showcasing the latest manufacturing technologies.

At the entrance, visitors will be greeted by a monument modelled after life-sized parts from a plastic model kit of Gundam, a world-famous giant robot from the long-running Japanese ani-

me franchise and a symbol of the country’s pop culture.

By establishing the new facility in Shizuoka, which aims to promote local revitalization through the city’s model industry, Bandai Spirits will try to draw plastic kit fans from Japan and abroad, encouraging them to experience the region’s craftsmanship.

Shizuoka has long been known as the nation’s hub for

model making, building on its tradition of woodworking fostered by rich natural surroundings, and later becoming home to leading plastic model makers, according to the local government.

Admission will be by reservation only, with tickets priced at 2,860 yen (\$19) for visitors aged 13 and older, 1,100 yen for those 12 and under, and free for pre-school children. — Kyodo

ALEXANDER Isak believes his departure from Newcastle is "in the best interests of everyone" after breaking his silence on the saga of the Premier League transfer window amid speculation over a move to Liverpool.

The Swedish international, who was the second-highest goalscorer in the Premier League last season, has not featured for the Magpies in pre-season or their opening game of the campaign, a 0-0 draw away at Aston Villa on Saturday.

Liverpool have reportedly had a £110 million bid (\$149 million) rejected for the 25-year-old, with Newcastle holding out for a British transfer record fee of up to £150 million.

Isak released a statement on Tuesday after deciding not to appear at the Professional Footballers' Association awards event despite being selected in the Premier League 2024/25 team of the year. "I've kept quiet for a long time while others have spoken. That silence has allowed people to push their own version of events, even though they know it doesn't reflect what was really said and agreed behind closed doors," Isak posted on Instagram. "The reality is that promises were made and the club has known my position for a long time. To now act as if these issues are only emerging is misleading. — AFP

The event marks the 80th anniversary of victory in the Chinese People's War of Resistance Against Japanese Aggression and the World Anti-Fascist War.

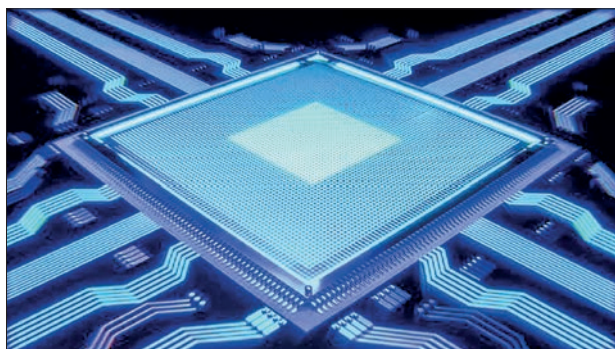

India's first packaged chip expected to be out by Dec 2025

"THE first packaged chip is expected to be out by December 2025," the Minister said in response to a questionnaire from ANI, besides underlining the status of India's nascent yet progressing semiconductor ecosystem.

The government has laid a pathway towards an India that will build chips for the world, aligned across

the supply chain, from assembly/testing to design, and manufacturing to exports, the minister said.

As on date, the government has approved 10 semiconductor manufacturing projects with a cumulative investment of more than Rs1.60 lakh crore in six states – Gujarat, Assam, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Odisha, and Andhra Pradesh. These projects, according to the minister, are expected to generate more than 29,000 direct jobs, depending on the maturity of factory automation.

Further, to strengthen semiconductor manufacturing, and creating a semiconductor ecosystem in the country, the government has entered into Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the US, European Union, Japan and Singapore.

Semiconductor manufacturing is a very complex and a technology intensive sector which requires specialized skilled manpower. To address this, a new curriculum was introduced by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) for VLSI Design and Technology, Integrated Circuit (IC) manufacturing. — ANI

Vietnam proposes car emission standards in major cities

VIETNAM is set to tighten car emission standards in the capital Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City beginning in 2027, according to a draft decision from the Ministry of Agriculture and Environment.

Cars manufactured from 2017 will be required to meet Level 4 standards from January 2027, while those produced from 2022 must comply with Level 5 standards starting January 2028, local newspaper Tuoi Tre (Youth) reported Wednesday.

Level 4 and Level 5 are categories defined under the circular on Vietnam's National Technical Regulations on Emissions of Automobiles Participating in Road Traffic, issued in June 2025, which set maximum permissible exhaust limits to reduce pollution and improve air quality. — Xinhua
