1,954 buildings in Mandalay, Sagaing, Nay Pyi Taw need major repairs, quake retrofits

TOTAL of 1,954 buildings in Mandalay, Sagaing, and Nay Pyi Taw require major repairs and reinforcement to withstand future shocks following the Mandalay earthquake, according to the Myanmar Earthquake Committee.

The committee invites interested engineers to volunteer for systematic inspections of buildings damaged by the Mandalay earthquake and is organizing earthquake clinics in major cities, including Nay Pyi Taw, Yangon, Mandalay, and Sagaing, starting on 9 April.

The committee, with the help of volunteer engineers from the earthquake clinic, is conducting a first-stage assessment of the reusability of damaged buildings in Sagaing, Mandalay, and Nay Pyi Taw, having surveyed about 20,000 buildings across these regions to date.

According to these surveys, there are a total of 14,604 reusable buildings in the three earthquake-affected areas of Mandalay, Sagaing, and Nay Pyi Taw, representing 75 per cent of the total number of damaged buildings. Additionally, 3,000 buildings require detailed inspection, and 1,954 buildings need major renovation and earthquake retrofitting. — ASH/TH



That enables terrorists to use civilians as human shields. Tatmadaw is committed to safeguarding the sovereignty of the State and will respond to these threats based on intelligence and prevailing conditions. Therefore, residents in areas where terrorists have taken control must prioritize their safety and protect themselves from being exploited by these groups.

Local, global aid continues flow to Myanmar after March quake

AS of 14 May, a total of 3,723 people died, 5,104 were injured, and 84 remain missing in six regions and states of Myanmar that were severely affected by the powerful earthquake that struck on 28 March.

Search and rescue teams from the Myanmar Fire Brigade, along with local and international rescue organizations, have been carrying out emergency operations in the affected areas without delay. So far, 653 people have been rescued alive from collapsed buildings, and the bodies of 800 deceased persons have been recovered.

Both local donors and

Between 5 pm on 13 May and 5 pm on 14 May, various forms of international assistance arrived at Yangon International Airport. Pillow, blanket, dried noodles, biscuits, and canned fish weighing 0.358 tonne from Kri Sakthi Nyanaethira Kanimadam Yogi Ramsuratkumar Shiramam and Persatuan Renganut Devi Shri Karumariamman Temple in Malaysia.

China donates 95 operation rooms, 1,804 modular houses for earthquake recovery

THE vessel MTT Sapangar, carrying 95 donated operation rooms from the People's Republic of China for Myanmar's earthquake recovery efforts, arrived at Thilawa (MITT) Port at 6:30 pm on 12 May. The Southern Venture ship, transporting 1,804 modular (prefabricated) houses, reached the port at 6:38 pm on 13 May.

The donations were a part of China's 14th batch of aid to Myanmar and were officially handed over yesterday morning at Thilawa Port. Yangon Region Chief Minister U Soe Thein, regional ministers, officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Publice Health Department, the Department of Disaster Management under the Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement and local authorities attended the handover ceremony. The equipment was received from Mr Ouyang Daobing, Economic Counsellor of the Chinese Embassy.



CBM to sell Forex to fuel importers

THE Central Bank of Myanmar (CBM) announced on 13 May that it would sell US\$23.67 million to fuel oil traders and 50 million baht to importers.

CBM sold over \$1.62 million on 13 May and over \$820,000 and 1.5 million baht on 12 May.

CBM also injected over 3.6 million baht on 9 May again in the financial market after over 5.3 million baht and 723,000 yuan on 8 May, and \$710,000 on 7 May into the financial market.

CBM announced on 6 May that it would sell \$33 million and 200 million baht to those engaged in the fuel oil industry. CBM sold 397,843 yuan on that day.

CBM injected over \$42 million, over 20 million baht and 500,000 yuan in April, over \$126 million, 320 million baht and 3.6 million yuan in March, over \$88 million, 7.5 million yuan and 161 million baht in February and over \$124 million, over 13.8 million baht and over 4.8 million yuan in January. CBM aims to curb the instability in the foreign exchange market and currency devaluation. According to CBM's notification on 15 March, it has been collab-

orating with law enforcement agencies to combat and prosecute those who attempt to manipulate the currency market under the existing laws. CBM allowed authorized dealers (private banks) to operate online foreign exchange trading freely as per the market rate, depending on supply and demand, starting from 5 December 2023. — NN/ KK

Department of Mines seeks bids for 300MT of cathode copper

THE Department of Mines under the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation invited a tender under an open procedure to sell 300 metric tonnes of cathode copper with kyat payment, according to the tender committee. The department will sell 300 metric tonnes of cathode copper (30 Lots) to domestic manufacturing businesses and micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs).

The floor price of the cathode copper will be set according to the global reference prices on the London Metal Exchange LME. The prices must be mentioned as (LME+ premium) in US dollars. Those with the highest offers will be announced as the tender winner. Cathode copper can be claimed in Yangon. Tender winners must bear transportation and loading and unloading costs from the mining site to Yangon. The tender submission will be closed by noon on 20 May 2025. Tender opening will be held at 3 pm on that day. Some of these recipient companies' bosses used the loans for themselves and converted them into US dollars to invest in overseas properties and assets. Now the government is left with K160 billion (US\$40 million) worth of potential bad debts.

There are still some business leaders who believe that a top-down approach of funding or giving money to them would create employment opportunities and, hence, somehow help the poor get out of the poverty trap. When I asked them whether she (the boss) is willing to employ someone bedridden because of tuberculosis, disabled or someone who can only come on irregular days to work. because he/she has to take care of the sick parents or siblings, she has no answer.


Businesses and companies are best helped by the government creating an environment that promotes enterprise and investments in the country. Giving them funds and incentives would not get Myanmar out of poverty, as COVID evidence has shown.

Hence, we need to strategize an alternative approach to mass poverty alleviation. Who better to learn from than China? GDP per capita of China has gone up from 300 four decades ago to 12,000+at present. It now possesses the biggest economy in the world! In terms of property alleviation en masse, no one has done it better than China in the history of this world. And contrary to the usual communist and socialist ideologies, they are not using the topdown approach to help the poor.

What foundations do we need?

First and foremost, we need to identify the poor. COVID loans in Myanmar may have been dispensed in a 'who knows who' format, but this certainly is only going to enrich those who are

Providing Psychological Support to Mandalay Earthquake-Affected People

AT 12:51 pm on 28 March 2025, a powerful earthquake with a magnitude of 7.7 on the Richter scale struck Myanmar. As a result of this Mandalay earthquake, the National Disaster Management Committee declared emergency conditions in the affected areas, including Sagaing Region, Mandalay Region, Magway Region, the north-

eastern part of Shan State, Nay Pyi Taw Union Territory, and Bago Region.

The recent earthquake in affected areas had left deep scars not only on the land and infrastructure but also on the hearts and minds of its people. As rescue operations and rebuilding efforts continue, it is vital to recognize that emotional healing must be

addressed alongside physical recovery. Providing psychological support to those affected is essential for restoring a sense of safety, hope, and resilience in the community.

 Understanding the Psychological Impact: Natural disasters often trigger intense emotional responses. Victims may experience fear, helplessness, grief, anxiety, and even guilt for surviving. Children may become withdrawn or clingy, while adults

might suffer from insomnia, depression, or post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). The emotional toll is often hidden but can be long-lasting if not properly addressed. Therefore, psychological support should be an integral part of any disaster response strategy.

 Immediate Psychological First Aid: In the aftermath of the Mandalay earthquake, the first step is to provide Psychological First Aid (PFA). This involves

already not poor. So, identifying the poor correctly is the first step in targeted poverty alleviation.

At the same time, being poor is not static. The poor today may not be poor the next day. Your circumstances can change. Hence, we need dynamic management that accompanies the identification process.

As with Mao's campaign, the success of the project depends on the grassroots support. With village residents' assistance and participation, the works of poverty alleviation are more likely to be successful.

Last, the support team of civil servants and partisans. They are the strength that is going to make the ideal work. The government can only give out policies, guidance and funding. It is the government officials who will implement and carry out the whole plan to make it a success.

How do we know who is poor?

When it comes to getting free handouts from the government, everyone wants to be poor. Just look at how the earthquake handouts were quickly snapped up again and again by repeaters. We need a systematic and scientific way of actually identifying the poor, so that the decision is not left to the whims and whimsical choices of ward administrators and village heads. The current corrupt practices by some of them in the selection of military conscripts came to mind.

China, when it started the programme, used the famous four looks to determine those in need: a house, food on the plate, able-bodied labour in the household and presence of a school-go-

ing child. Scores and weights are given for details of each look. Later, 'having a bedridden patient' is added to the list. Some provinces added a negative list to remove certain populations from the poor list, too. An example of a negative list would be ownership of a machine or motorcycle.

Dynamic management, residents' assistance and support

After identifying the poor, the dynamic nature of life requires that the list needs verification at the village or ward level, nomination by representatives, appraisal by higher authorities, announcement to the public, correction if needed, arbitration if disputed and review if necessary.

The support of the programme by all residents would ensure that the poor themselves are motivated to get out of poverty. The mindset has to be altered from getting as many handouts as possible to being motivated to determine one's destiny. The assistance by capable and well-off residents would also help in the team effort to alleviate poverty.

The team of civil servants implementing the scheme is also critical to the success of the program. They must love the people, act with integrity at all times, work hard, be scientific in their approach, yet realistic, unafraid to face challenges and love the country enough to fully dedicate themselves to this cause. They will be the contact points between the central government and the village. They will provide all the services the programme needs and supervise all the aspects of the programme.

How do we do that?

The key is to combine village-level industrialization with targeted property alleviation. China industrialized the villages in four key ways: -

- Upgrading the planting and breeding industries by improving productivity and providing access to the market.
- E-commerce facilitates the village wares and produce to be sold throughout the whole country using e-commerce platforms.
- Tourism by promoting unique village attractions. nature and the surrounding environment
- Photovoltaic cells sell electricity generated by solar energy to other regions and provinces in need.

Is that all?

Many books have been written on the triumph of targeted poverty alleviation in China. Even President Xi Jinping has a book, 'Up and Out of Poverty', specifically putting down his own experiences on the programme.

The programme is large, nationwide and requires unwavering commitment from all those involved.

In the later parts, we shall look at the other essentials of its success, entrepreneurship and employment, ecological issues, human resource development, mobilisation, reforms, public services and exit and prevention of return to poverty.

Myanmar may be slow at this point in tackling this face-saving issue, but as Confucius said, "It does not matter how slowly you go as long as you do not stop".

✤ Creating Safe Spaces and Community Support: Establishing safe spaces for creating a calm and supportive different age groups is crucial.

Child-friendly areas allow children to play, express themselves, and regain a sense of normalcy. For adults, group discussions, religious ceremonies, or storytelling sessions can foster mutual support and healing. Cultural and spiritual practices play an important role in the psychological recovery process and should be respectfully incorporated into support efforts.

✤ Educating for Mental Wellness: Psycho-education is a powerful tool in disaster response. Short community sessions can explain that emotional reactions are normal and temporary. People should be taught coping strategies such as deep breathing, maintaining routines, and talking about their experiences. It is equally important to dispel myths and reduce stigma

around seeking mental health support.

 Professional Counselling and Long-Term Support: While many people recover with community support, others may require professional mental health care. Individuals showing signs of severe trauma, such as persistent nightmares, panic attacks or thoughts of selfharm, should be referred to psychologists or counsellors. Collaborating with local healthcare providers and NGOs ensures a coordinated and sustainable mental health response.

✤ Caring for Caregivers and Volunteers: Those working on the front lines, rescue workers, doctors, and volunteers are also vulnerable to emotional exhaustion. Regular rest, peer support, and access to counselling should be provided to prevent burnout and secondary trauma.

✤ Rebuilding with Hope: Psychological support does not end when the rubble is cleared. Long-term recovery should include community-building activities, education, and job training. When people feel a sense of purpose and connection, their mental health improves. Remembering and honouring the lives lost through memorials or ceremonies can also aid emotional closure.

Moreover, disasters like the Mandalay earthquake, the wounds left on the mind are as real as those on the body. Providing psychological support helps survivors not only to cope but also to rebuild their lives with strength and dignity. By addressing mental health needs with compassion and cultural understanding, we support the foundation for true healing and resilience.



Cruise unleashes 'Mission: Impossible' juggernaut at Cannes

The blockbuster is set to ramp up adrenaline levels and promises to somewhat lighten the tone at Cannes.

TOM Cruise's "Mission: Impossible - The Final Reckoning" powers into the Cannes film festival for its premiere on Wednesday on a steamroller of hype.

With some fans fretting that the \$400-million epic — the eighth in the high-octane franchise — could be the last, Cruise and director Christopher Mc-Quarrie have been teasing up the tension by dropping contradictory clues about its future.

Cruise, 62, has also been sharing heart-stopping footage of the stunts he did for the movie on social media, including discussing a freefall jump from a helicopter at 10,000 feet (3,000 metres). He is seen jumping from the chopper high over a South African mountain range and putting himself into a high-speed spin with a camera strapped to his stomach.

India's defence exports saw 34-fold jump over the past decade: Rajnath Singh

India's defence production has reached record levels, largely due to the "Make in India" initiative.

DEFENCE exports from India are at all-time highs, having risen a whopping 34-fold over the past decade.

"India exported defence goods worth Rs23,622 crore in 2024-25 — a 34-fold rise as against just Rs686 crore in 2013-14," Defence Minister Rajnath Singh's office said in a post on X.

The defence minister's office asserted that India's defence sector is growing stronger than ever, driven by the spirit of a self-reliant or Atmanirbhar Bharat.

As part of its 'Atmanirbhar' and Make in India plans, the

government launched various schemes, including the production-linked incentive (PLI), in various sectors to make Indian manufacturers globally competitive, attract investments, enhance exports, integrate India into the global supply chain, and reduce dependency on imports.

With the government's thrust on the Make in India initiative, defence production has surged to historic highs. This rise in defence manufacturing has also led to substantial returns for investors in major defence manufacturing PSUs over the past years. — ANI

US inflation cooled in Apr as Trump began tariff rollout

US President Donald Trump on Tuesday hailed cooler-than-expected April inflation data and reiterated his call for the Federal Reserve to cut interest rates, as analysts warned that his tariffs may still fuel price hikes in the months ahead.

The April data covers the

early days of Trump's new levies against most countries — including steep duties on China — which spooked financial markets and raised fears of a spike in US prices.

Trump has since scaled back some of the duties and paused others, helping to soothe nervous investors, though tariffs remain well above their recent historical average.

The consumer price index (CPI) eased to 2.3 per cent in April from a year ago, a tick below the 2.4 per cent figure recorded in March, the Labour Department said in a statement.

The April CPI release was the smallest 12-month increase since February 2021, and was slightly lower than the median estimate from

US may reduce oil production because of sluggish demand and falling crude prices: S&P

UNITED States may reduce its oil production which could lead to an annual decline in output in 2026 due to the sluggish demand and falling crude prices, according to a new analysis by S&P Global Commodity Insights.

The report further added that slowing global oil demand, extreme uncertainty about the future of US trade and a coming supply surplus are expected to hobble US oil production growth.

The S&P Global Commodity Insights Global Crude Oil Markets Short-term Outlook adds that global oil (total liquids) demand growth to average 750,000 barrels per day (b/d) in 2025, a downward revision of 500,000 b/d from the prior outlook. — ANI

A government resolution issued the same day out-

lines the project's key timeline, including the completion of the technical design within May 2025. The railway project, which is set to pass through nine Vietnamese provinces and cities, is expected to play a key role in enhancing regional connectivity and promoting economic development in northern Vietnam. — Xinhua

Indonesia's retail sales expected to dip in Apr after Eid surge

RETAIL sales in Indonesia were forecast to decline in April on a month-on-month basis, mainly due to the normalization of public demand following the end of the Islamic holy month of Ramadan. According to a survey by Bank Indonesia released on Wednesday, sales in several categories, including information and communication equipment, household equipment, as well as food, beverages, and tobac-

co, were expected to fall. In contrast, continued growth was projected in areas such as spare parts and accessories, motor vehicle fuel, and clothing. Inflationary pressures over the next three and six months are

expected to ease, as reflected in the General Price Expectation Index, which declined to 146.4 for June and 153.1 for September, from 148.3 and 155.5, respectively, in the previous period. —Xinhua

Tesla's Shanghai Gigafactory reports strong exports in Apr

The New Model Y was launched in China in January 2025 and is now being exported to Australia and several Asian markets, including the Republic of Korea (ROK).

TESLA'S Shanghai Gigafactory exported nearly 30,000 vehicles in April, marking its highest monthly export volume in the past 12 months, the company said on Wednesday. This achievement comes as the China-made Model Y gains strong popularity tralia and multiple Asian markets including the Republic of Korea (ROK), according to Tesla.

The US electric auto giant's first-quarter earnings report revealed that the New Model Y helped the company achieve a record-high single-day order volume in the Asia-Pacific market following its launch.

In the ROK alone, the New Model Y sparked a buying frenzy on the very first day orders opened.

Tesla's official website briefly crashed due to overwhelming traffic, while Korean consumers lined up outside showrooms in large numbers. — Xinhua

Canada: Mark Carney unveils 38-member cabinet; Anita Anand named Foreign Affairs Minister

Mark Carney, sworn in as Canada's 24th Prime Minister in March 2025, emphasizes a strong commitment to protecting Canada's sovereignty.

CANADIAN Prime Minister Mark Carney on Tuesday unveiled a 38-member cabinet, comprising 28 ministers and 10 Secretaries of State.

The Cabinet is also supported by 10 Secretaries of State who will provide dedicated leadership on key issues and priorities within their minister's portfolio.

Following the unveiling of the new Cabinet, Carney out-

lined the government's top priorities — creating new economic and security relationships with the United States, tackling the cost of living, and strengthening Canada's economy.

Sharing a post on X, Carney wrote, "Canada, meet your new Cabinet. This is a team that is empowered and expected to lead. Together, we will create a new economic and security relationship with the United States and build a stronger economy — the strongest economy in the G7." In another post, he wrote, "Canadians elected this new government with a strong mandate: to define a new economic and security relationship with the United States, bring down the cost of living, and build a stronger economy. This new cabinet is focused, ready, and built for this moment." — ANI

Harvard hit by \$450m federal cut over antisemitism claims

THE US administration announced it will terminate \$450 million in grants to Harvard University, a day after the institution's president criticized the government for threatening key freedoms.

The latest cuts, announced by the Joint Task Force to Combat Antisemitism on Tuesday, are on top of more than \$2.2 billion in federal funds that were frozen last month. Harvard is suing the US administration over demands the government made over its academic and disciplinary policies.

Harvard University President Alan Garber wrote to Education Secretary Linda McMahon on Monday to deny her allegation that the school has a partisan political bias, warning that government "overreach" is threatening key freedoms.

The government coalition slammed Harvard in a letter on Tuesday for failing to confront "pervasive race discrimination and antisemitic harassment". – Xinhua

Israel PM says army entering Gaza 'with full force' in coming days

ISRAELI Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said the military would enter Gaza "with full force" in the coming days, a statement from his office said Tuesday.

"In the very coming days, we are going in with full force to complete the operation. Completing the operation means defeating Hamas. It means destroying Hamas," Netanyahu said during a meeting with injured reserve soldiers in his office late Monday.

"There will be no situation where we stop the war. A temporary cease fire might happen, but we are going all the way," he added. $-{\rm AFP}$

Peruvian PM resigns ahead of no-confidence vote

PERUVIAN Prime Minister Gustavo Adrianzen submitted his resignation Tuesday, hours before Congress was set to debate at least three motions seeking his removal.

"In consideration of the nation's higher interests, I feel duty-bound to present my irrevocable resignation from the position of president of the Council of Ministers," Adrianzen said in a televised address.

He was joined by his cabinet and President Dina Boluarte, who has consistently defended him and praised his performance. – Xinhua

S Korea Starbucks in a froth over

presidential candidates names

STARBUCKS in South Korea has banned customers from using the names of the country's presidential candidates — or the disgraced ex-president for their orders, the coffee giant told AFP on Wednesday.

South Korea is holding snap presidential elections on 3 June, to decide who will replace impeached former president Yoon Suk Yeol, ousted last month for his disastrous attempt to impose martial law in December.

In South Korea, Starbucks stores run a "Call My Name" service, which allows customers to select a nickname — which they input via the Starbucks app — that baristas use to announce orders when complete.

Customers will not be able to use the names of all seven presidential candidates, includ-

ing frontrunner Lee Jae-myung, and main conservative rival Kim Moon-soo, until after the vote, the company said.

Starbucks said that they had taken the action, which was announced this week as official campaigning started, based on past experience of customers misusing the "Call My Name" feature during previous elections. — AFP

Boxing: Injured Tsutsumi to be named "champion in recess" by WBA



WBA bantamweight champion Seiya Tsutsumi of Japan said Wednesday he is set to become a "champion in recess" after undergoing eye surgery.

When a champion is unable to defend his title within the prescribed period for medical reasons, he may be considered champion in recess and required to return to activity within a limited time frame under the World Boxing Association rules. Failure to do so may result in the loss of that recognition.

"I've been fighting eye problems for the past two years. But I've now had surgery. I'm recovering well."

In February, Tsutsumi successfully defended his belt with a hard-fought draw against compatriot Daigo Higa.

After that, Tsutsumi was unable to arrange a unification match against interim champion Antonio Vargas of the United States, which had been ordered by the WBA. Tsutsumi is expected to face Vargas when he returns to the ring. — Kyodo

Masters champion McIlroy to headline Australian Open

MASTERS champion Rory McIlroy will play in the Australian Open for the next two years, the world number two said Wednesday, ending a long absence from the tournament.

The Northern Irishman became just the sixth golfer to complete a career grand slam of all four majors with his dramatic play-off win at Augusta last month.

On the eve of the second major of the year, the US PGA Championship at Quail Hollow, McIlroy announced he will tee up in the Australian Open from 4-7 December this year at the world-renowned Royal Melbourne course.

The 36-year-old will return to Australia in 2026 when the prestigious event moves to the nearby Kingston Heath course.

"I'm proud to be committing to the Australian Open for the next two years, especially with it being played on the world-class Melbourne Sandbelt, somewhere I've always wanted to play professionally," McIlroy said.

The success of the 121-yearold tournament is "important for the global game", he said. — AFP

Sinner moves through gears to reach Italian Open quarters

JANNIK Sinner came through the first true test of his comeback from a doping ban with Tuesday's straight-sets win over Francisco Cerundolo which took the world number one into the Italian Open quarterfinals.


Italian Sinner bested 17th seed Cerundolo 7-6 (7/2), 6-3 in a match which was delayed by a couple of hours due to a torrential downpour to set up a last-eight clash with either Casper Ruud or Jaume Munar.

Cerundolo knocked out Sinner in the last 16 the last time he played here in 2023, but that was before the 23-year-old had became the tournament-winning machine he is today.

Sinner is finding his feet in Rome, his first tournament since the end of a three-month suspension accepted in February from the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) following two positive tests for traces of clostebol in March last year. His true target is the French Open which follows his home event and he showed some signs of rediscovering the form which has won him three Grand Slams and last year's ATP Finals. — AFP

Australian champion cyclist Dennis gets suspended sentence after wife's road death

AUSTRALIAN Olympic cyclist Rohan Dennis received a suspended jail sentence after pleading guilty to dangerous driving in a road incident that led to the death of his wife, fellow Olympian Melissa Hoskins. Australian former world champion cyclist Rohan Dennis avoided jail Wednesday for driving in a way "likely to cause harm" before his car struck and killed his Olympian wife Melissa Hoskins.

A judge in South Australia handed down a suspended sentence of nearly 17 months citing his guilty plea, his remorse and his role as sole carer of their young children. Dennis, 34, admitted last year to an "aggravated act likely to cause harm" over the December 2023 road incident, which ended in retired track cyclist Hoskins' death.

Dennis, an Olympic medallist in 2012 and 2021, was not charged with causing her death. — AFP

China, EU seek stronger bond as ties mark 50 years

IPLOMATS and experts from China and the European Union (EU) on Wednesday called for strengthening cooperation amid rising global challenges, as the two sides celebrate the 50th anniversary of diplomatic relations this year. Organized by the EU Delegation to China, the conference titled "Encouraging Balance, Upholding Commitments, Embracing Responsibilities" brought together around 500 participants from both sides in Beijing.

Michel Barnier, former prime minister of France and former EU commissioner, delivered a keynote speech, noting that the EU and China must work together on economic stability, global free and fair trade, as well as climate change and other global challenges. He underscored people-to-people exchanges as the foundation for fostering deeper relations.

Li Jian, director general for European affairs with China's foreign ministry, said that over the past 50 years, China-EU relations have become more mature and resilient. "As long as both sides respect each other, engage in equal consultations, and address each other's legitimate concerns, we will certainly overcome difficulties and resolve differences," Li added.

Speaking with Xinhua, Jorge Toledo Albinana, EU ambassador to China, said that EU-China relations have developed into one of the most consequential relations in the world. — Xinhua

US, Saudi Arabia ink massive \$142 billion arms deal: statement

THE US and Saudi Arabia signed a mammoth arms deal Tuesday that the White House called the largest "in history"

amid a raft of agreements inked by Donald Trump and Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman in Riyadh.

The Saudis escorted Air Force One into the kingdom with fighter jets before bringing out long-stretching guards of honour and sending flag-waving cavalry to accompany Trump's motorcade to the palace. Under imposing chandeliers, Trump welcomed a promise by Saudi Arabia's de facto ruler, Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, for \$600 billion in investment and quipped that it should be \$1 trillion. The White House said that Saudi Arabia would buy nearly \$142 billion in weapons in what it described as the largest-ever weapons deal, although Trump in his first term trumpeted a larger, longer-term figure. -AFP

ERDOGAN'S SUPPORT

Zelensky says he will meet only with Putin, not other Russian officials

UKRAINIAN President Volodymyr Zelensky will not meet with any Russian official other than President Vladimir Putin in Türkiye, Interfax-Ukraine reported on Tuesday, citing Ukrainian presidential advisor Mykhailo Podolyak. According to Podolyak, a lower-level bilateral meeting in Erdogan said that Türkiye is stepping up its diplomatic

Istanbul would be "pointless", as Russian ministers likely lack the authority to make substantive decisions. On Sunday, President Putin proposed resuming direct negotiations with Ukraine on 15 May in Türkiye. Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan reiterated his support for a ceasefire between Russia and Ukraine during a meeting with NATO Secretary-General Mark Rutte in Ankara on Tuesday, according to the Turkish presidency. efforts to achieve a just and lasting peace, noting that he has spoken with both Putin and Zelensky, said a statement issued by the presidency. Erdogan emphasized that Türkiye maintains its neutral stance in the conflict and urged that the opportunity for peace should not be missed. – Xinhua
